

The purpose of this document is to reflect the changes that should be made to PSDC-940-006-01. Suggested changes are *emphasized* while the old version is shown in a footnote.

1 Section 3.4.1: Batch File Naming Convention

Batch files must be uniquely named within a job to facilitate verification of the job manifest. *Batches and jobs are related through an ID number: the Batch ID and the Job ID numbers are equals¹.*

A batch file must be named using the following case- sensitive naming convention:

$$B<JobID>.tar.gz$$

where <JobID> is a unique 8-digits positive integer².

¹It is also preferable to relate the batch to a job.

²A batch file must be named using the following case-sensitive naming convention: JOBID.BATCHID.EXT Where: "JOBID" is the literal 'J' followed by a sequence number identifying the job to which the batch belongs; e.g, "J1" for the first job. "BATCHID" is the literal 'B' followed by a sequence number uniquely identifying the batch, given the context of the JOBID; i.e., the BATCHID is initialized to 1 for every job; and, "EXT" is the literal "tar.gz". For example, the first batch file for the first job should have the filename J1.B1.jar.gz
